Auf ihrem Überseeflug beförderte die Do X neben Passagieren auch tausende Postsendungen. Das Beförderungsentgelt enthielt zum einen die jeweilige Gebühr der Reichspost und diente zum anderen der Mitfinanzierung des Fluges der Do X. In einem erstmalig in einem Flugzeug befindlichen Bordpostamt wurden die Poststücke bearbeitet.

Dies ist der einzige, bisher registrierte Beleg einer Do X-Postaufgabe in Puerto Rico. Befördert wurde der Brief am 21. August 1931 auf der Flugetappe San Juan/Puerto Rico nach Miami/Florida. Neben einem großen Landungsstempel trägt er die Unterschriften von Besatzungsmitgliedern und der Passagierin Clara Adams.

#### EIN SCHIFF FLIEGT UM DIE WELT

Die Do X ankerte vor dem Zuckerhut in Rio de Janeiro ...

Das Flugschiff Do X startete am 5. November 1930 vom Bodensee zu seinem großen Überseeflug. Bereits zu Beginn des Repräsentationsfluges fand das Flugschiff in Holland, England, Frankreich, Spanien und Portugal große Beachtung.

Der Weiterflug von Lissabon über den Atlantik konnte nicht termingemäß durchgeführt werden, da die Do X durch einen Brand an der Tragfläche schwer beschädigt wurde. Erst am 31. Januar 1931 startete das Flugschiff zum Südatlantikflug. Entlang der afrikanischen Küste flog sie bis Bubaque (Guinea-Bissau), überquerte den Atlantik in Rekordzeit und landete schließlich in Rio de Janeiro. An zahlreichen, weiteren Landeplätzen besuchten tausende von Menschen das größte Flugzeug der Welt. Am 27. August 1931 landete die Do X in New York. Aufgrund von Wartungs- und Überholungsarbeiten und zur Überwinterung gab es hier einen längeren Aufenthalt.

Von New York aus startete die Do X am 19. Mai 1932 zu ihrem Nordatlantikflug. Nach Zwischenlandungen in Neufundland, auf den Azoren, in Spanien und England beendete das Flugschiff nach über 43.500 km am 24. Mai 1932 seine Reise - die Do X wasserte umjubelt auf dem Müggelsee in Berlin.
