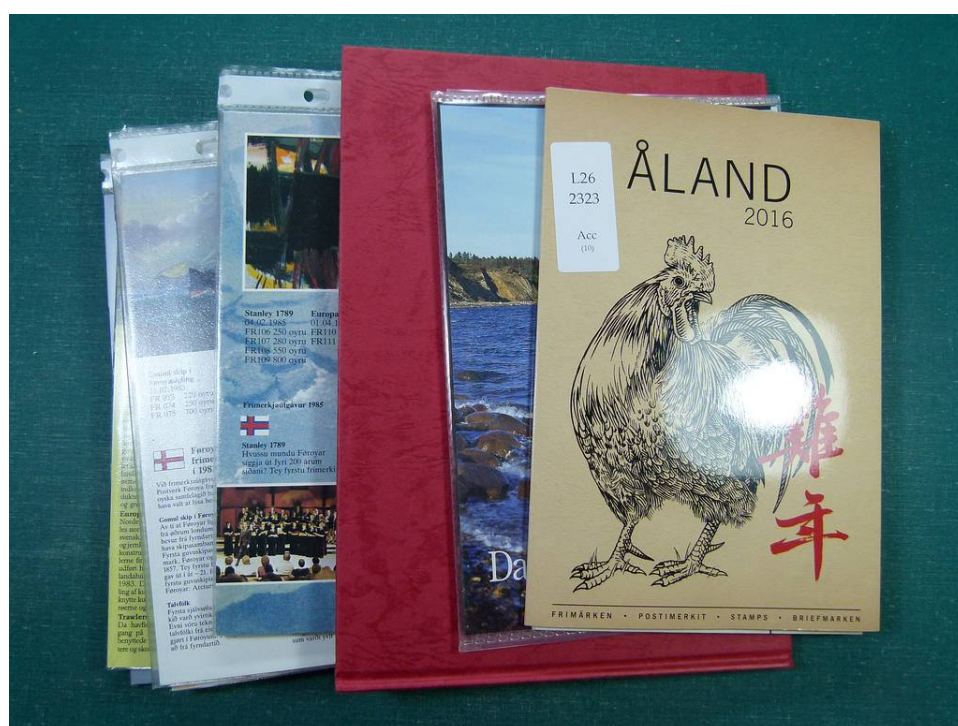

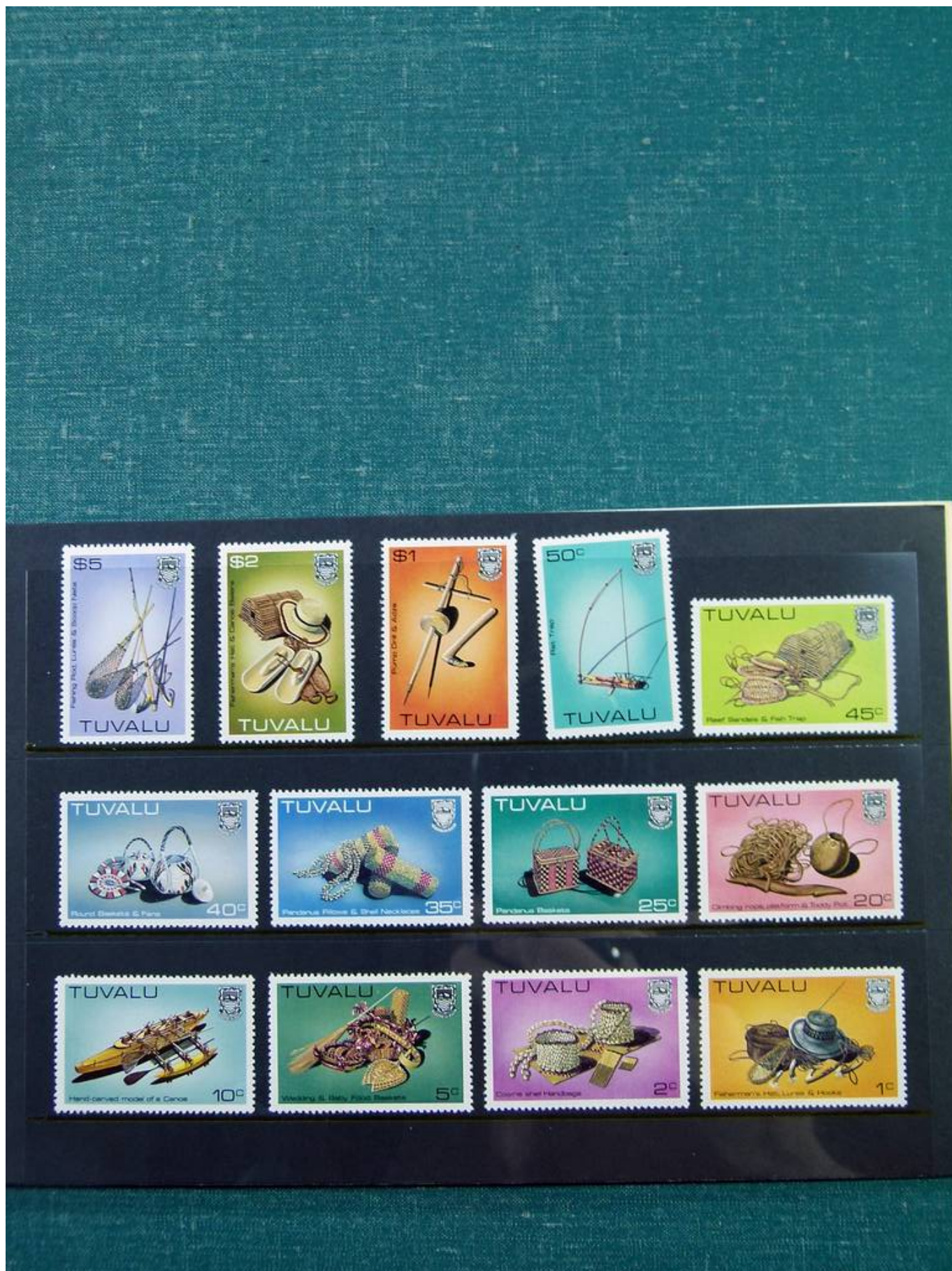

The 10c stamp depicts a television van (for video pictures) and a tape recorder (for recording pictures). The outside of the broadcast van is used to record or transmit directly special events from venues outside the studio; for instance, the National Day Parade at the Padang.

The 35c stamp depicts a TV studio – the place where the great majority of TV programmes are produced. Selected for highlighting are key pieces of equipment – lighting, camera and microphone – without which no programme can be produced.

The 75c stamp illustrates a transmitting tower and a TV receiver set with an antenna. These are used for the telecast and reception of TV programmes.

The \$1 stamp shows a telecommunication satellite dish antenna and the global TV screen. Events taking place all over the world are transmitted via a communication satellite in space for reception by TV stations. This is another means by which TV programmes, especially 'live' transmissions from abroad, are relayed.

Depicted in this set of stamps, issued to mark the 10th year of National Courtesy Campaign, are some of the basic acts of courtesy. Featured on the stamps is Singa, the courtesy mascot, which has given the

campaign a unique identity since his debut in 1982. The 10c stamp depicts the need to greet neighbours; the 30c stamp the necessity to queue at service counters; and the \$1 stamp shows the need to help our elders.

The Singapore Fire Service also operates a round-the-clock accident and emergency ambulance service, and has been increasingly engaged in rescue operations. Each year, the Service responds to more than 10,000 fire calls, 50,000 ambulance calls and 700 rescue calls. The Service also maintains fire regulatory functions to ensure that fire safety measures are incorporated in buildings.

From those humble beginnings, the Singapore Fire Service has grown to an establishment of 1,300 officers and men, 11 fire stations, a vehicle repair and maintenance workshop and a fleet of 62 fire

Shown on the 10c stamps is the latest 30 metre turntable ladder fire engine used in modern aerial fire fighting and rescue. In contrast, depicted on the \$1 stamps is the early steam fire engine, the pride of the Singapore Fire Brigade in the 1890s.
